SUGGESTIONS FOR TEACHING THIS SONG...

- Children hold up both hands for the ten plagues during the chorus.
- The song works very well after the classic Pesach songs – Oh Listen and One Morning. If using it that way, skip verse 1 and start with the chorus.
- With preschoolers, don't sing the verses as written; instead, zip in the plagues that the children remember: God sent ___ and ___ and ___ (2x), then the pre-chorus.
- End with the chorus, and continue with the Pesach story!
